As in past years the local school children will be first to perform and the community choir will lead the carol sing along. Flying in for the evening's end will be a visit from the jolly man in red.

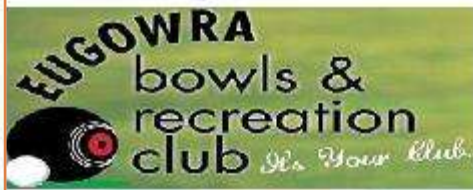
As in last year's event Kerry Hodge of Kelso will also be performing.

Once decorated and dry, place one head shape face down, place the lollypop on top (lining up the sweet with the hole in the card) and then place the other head shape face up on top.

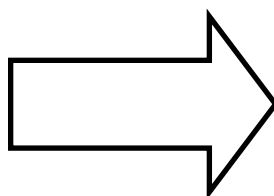
Step 6.

School Holiday Ideas

While we all love the holiday season, mums, dads and grandparents know it can be tricky keeping the kids happy and out of trouble for 6 weeks.

Here are some ideas for the whole family to try. Most of the ideas don't take much preparation and are relatively mess free.

1. Cookie decorating. Pick a theme - Christmas, animals, shapes etc. Gather supplies and set up a work space and let the kids decorate their own cookies.
2. Create a fort. Using dining tables and chairs and a table cloth or bed sheet. Get creative and add fairy lights, cushions, soft toys etc. the kid's imagination will do the rest.
3. Use masking tape to form a "road" for kids cars... along carpet, over chairs, under tables... Masking tape is easy enough to remove after the game is over.
4. Get into gardening. Potted colour and some cheap pots and a bit of dirt is all you need. Encourage the kids to water their little plant every day to keep it thriving.
5. Old bread in the freezer? Grab it out and head to a park with some water nearby. The ducks are always hungry.
6. Set up an obstacle course in the backyard. Hoola hoops, logs, stones... anything the kids can go under, over or around. Set it up and time each other, see who can make the best time.
7. The holiday period is a great time to donate any un-wanted items to those in need. The kids might not be into it at first, but ask them to gather any old toys (not broken), clothes that no longer fit, books no longer read etc... a small reward at the end might inspire them.
8. Puzzle races. As kids, my siblings and I would take out puzzles of equal difficulty and race to see who finished first. Board games are another way to spend some time together - particularly on bad weather days.
9. Head to the Pool! This one is a no brainer - Australian summers are hot and every kid loves the pool. Just don't forget the hat, sun cream, and to stay hydrated.
10. On days that aren't too hot, pack a picnic lunch and venture outdoors. There are plenty of local spots to enjoy some family outdoor dining. However, even your own backyard can be a fun spot to set up a blanket and enjoy some sandwiches and cake.

Recipe of the Month



Chocolate Roll Cake

This recipe was given to me by Kay Shine in 1991, I have made it many times since.

4 eggs

½ cup of Self raising flour

1 dessertspoon of cornflour

1 teaspoon of golden syrup

½ cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon Carb soda

Pinch salt

2 tablespoons cocoa.

Grease and line swiss roll tray.

I use small basin with mixmaster.

Beat eggs (I beat whites first then add yolks) add sugar and sifted dry ingredients

Add heated golden syrup last.

Bake in a moderate oven for 18-20 minutes at 180 degrees.

Roll in dry sugared cloth for 3 minutes, unroll ,when cool fill with whipped cream.

EUGOWRA FITNESS PATH

We thank those of the community who made comments to the preliminary plan for the fitness path.

This was the start towards a project intended for the benefit of all the community and hopefully bring healthier life styles opportunities.

In moving the project through the community Ann and I thought it should be viewed by Cabonne Council at this preliminary stage. We wrote to council requesting a meeting with them in regard to the election of the new council. We needed to consider an appropriate date.

On Wednesday 11th of October 11 am I met with the Mayor, General Manager and the director of engineering at Molong. I put the case of the fitness path together with the plan and comments by you the community. A written list of outcomes from discussions with the football club displaying solutions to their needs was shown. We paid particular attention to the "Hill" and the way we had to keep this and not interfere with this part of the oval. In the discussions with the football club we came up with an idea to make a platform around the area, so as not to interfere with the connecting path way.

Comment from the General Manager at this point was "There cannot be any item above the ground level, as this is a floodway". I asked about the rest of the plan where we have exercise equipment and gardens, seats in the land scape. Repeated, "This is a floodway". With this comment it seemed the path could not be connected in a safe way. If a concrete path was the only item left at ground level and not connected, there was not much left to work on from this plan.

We are saddened to say this may be the end of this project. I assume this applies to any other items of this nature that are written in the Recreation Ground Management Plan by council on page 3 section KPI Monitoring. Aims, "shelter from sun, rain and bad weather". I worry about the football club with their goals towards more lighting for the ground.

Ann, Sally and I leave you to consider these facts above and we hope council have their views in writing to be published in this issue of the Eugowra News.

Further to the above Ann and I respect those who have made comments about the plan that is "It would be practical to build pathways around the town". In view of this and the issues above we are requesting to call a community meeting next month [November] with Cabonne council and ask questions related to these issues/ideas.

This article has gone to Cabonne Council with a request for Cabonne to attend a November community meeting and any comments council may like to make about the article in this issue.

A list of comments made by you from the displayed preliminary plan will be at the Supermarket, RTC, butchers and the Central Hotel for your information.

\$3.00 for adults

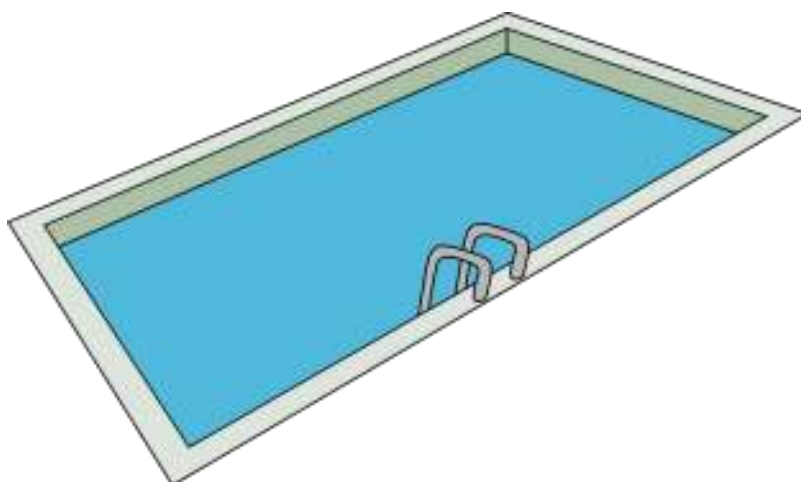

Pool receives invaluable life saving equipment

The Eugowra pool committee has been requesting the council for a spine board, and now with budget allocations the pool has received the board as well as an

Automatic external defibrillator.

David Hyde said “We are very grateful to the Cabonne Council.”

The board is in fact a Flotation spinal board, designed for rescuing people out of water. Its main use is for Spinal cord injuries and drownings.

The defibrillator works in conjunction with CPR by the pool staff.

Local ambo and first aid trainer, Jack Barnes attended Eugowra pool on 14th November to provide extensive training to pool staff. The training included not only instructions on how to use the equipment, but also some very important information on what to do if an emergency occurs.

Jack stressed that in times of emergencies, people tend to panic and run for help, or equipment. However keeping a level head is so important. In order to help others and use the equipment correctly it is imperative you remain calm and in control.

As we head into summer it would be mindful to become aware of water and pool safety. The first 8 minutes after somebody has a drowning incident are crucial. Whilst most people won't have access to the pool equipment, knowledge of what to do in such circumstances and how to give CPR should be something we are aware of.

Forbes Advocate Friday 3 November 1950.

Early newspaper reports from Eugowra often mention impounded livestock. With few secure fences around properties mostly the livestock were controlled by shepherds or stockmen. The name of Hanbury Clements of Eugowra Station was often mentioned in the reports of impounded stock and the Poundkeeper, J Maher, must have been kept busy. It is not known if many of the impounded stock were claimed by their

EUGOWRA.—Impounded at Eugowra, on the 30th day of March, 1878, by order of H. Clements, Esq., J.P.: sum due at date of notice set after each animal:—
 Flea-bitten gray mare, like CV near shoulder, JM in one off shoulder, broken, aged, 15 months; 7s.
 Also, on the 31st, from Natusa Run, by order of J. S. Campbell, Esq.:—
 Dark bay or brown horse, star and snip, off hind foot white, collar-marked, 7s over OS near shoulder, 7 years, 17 hands; 5s. 6d.
 Bay colt, P over CM near shoulder, underbred, about 4 years; 5s.
 If not released, will be sold at this Pound at noon on the 25th April, 1878.
 2346—3s. J. MAHER, Poundkeeper.

We often hear of the floods of 1916, 1928, 1950, later 50s, 70s, 1990 and later in Eugowra, but there was another quite invasive flood in 1931 according to some newspaper reports, but other papers claimed that the water did not enter premises. As usual in times of other floods, the water watchers were busy keeping watch from the bridge. Businesses shown in the distance would have included the old Grocery store extreme left, Refreshment rooms, Billiard rooms, Garage, District stores, Butchery and Baker. This was prior to the building of the CBC Bank, now our RTC/PO. It seems a cloth sign saying the Eugowra



The Imperial Theatre was built in 1927, but not too long after it was completely burnt out with much considerable loss. However, as the last photograph (1931) shows, it was soon up and running. The little building next door appears to be housing a Barber at the time.
