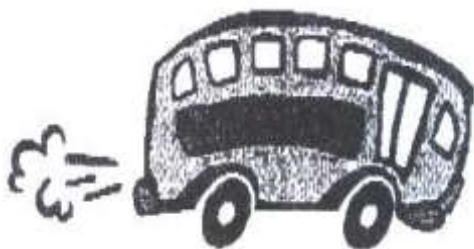

# Notes from the Happy Gardener



Hello to all,

Christmas is only a few weeks away and many people will be thinking about gift buying, food preparation, etc. Of course many are hoping for their harvest to go well, be free of breakdowns, have fine weather, a good yield and finally to receive a good and fair price for their commodity.

There is sure to be quite an amount of entertaining taking place over the festive season. We all like things to be nice and as special as we can make it especially at Christmas time. The heat accompanied by the drying winds which we often experience at this time of year make keeping the whole garden looking lush a hard task, so giving attention to outdoor areas where family and friends gather, such as verandahs, pergolas and BBQ areas, would seem to be the sensible way to go.

If you would like to make your place a bit more decorative in a hurry and without a lot of expense I suggest you might like to take a look at the huge and varied range of pots available.

Of course, there isn't always a need to purchase pots as all kinds of receptacles may be used e.g. old tins, buckets, wooden boxes and cane baskets lined with a bit of plastic (make sure to make a couple of drainage holes in the plastic). For containers which you cannot put drainage holes in, simply plant up a plastic container and sit this inside your chosen receptacle.

Old tins and buckets can be given a new lease on life, look good and unique when painted in bright colours. A little bit of getting a bit arty will give some instant appeal.

Advantages of using pots are, that they are quick and easy to plant and easily changed to suit the season and occasion, may be moved to different or preferred placement.

There is a multitude of various plantings and ways of arranging pots of which I will mention only a few:-

Elevate an urn pot on a low wall or on top of another pot turned upside down. It will look very attractive with a cordyline or fountain grass in the centre and a trailing pelargonium spilling over the sides.

A cluster of small pots filled with flowering annuals would add charm and cheerfulness to any area.

Try a standard rose or a tall plant surrounded by lower growing plants creating a layered look in a large pot. It makes for interest and charm.

Petunia varieties (we all know) are always reliable easy care colourful plants which are hard to go past and do very well in pots.

Variegated and coloured foliage plants create an interesting alternative to blooming plants.

For a less flamboyant look, nobody can go past the water wise, heat tolerant, easy care succulents

Nearly all nurseries have lots of lovely small potted colour options available which means a desired look can be achieved almost instantly.

Matching pots can look nice in a row along the edge of a verandah.

A matching pair of pots placed one on each side of the door can give a classic look.

Selecting your growing vessel is a matter of your choice and so also is what you grow in it. It always adds interest to try something a bit different and the combinations and choices are almost endless.

Remember pots dry out quickly in hot weather therefore regular watering is a must.

Water regularly (about ten day intervals) with a liquid fertiliser, trim off spent blooms which will promote flowering and retain a compact and tidy plant.

## Jobs for December

Dead head roses regularly, watch for sucking pests, treat accordingly as necessary.

Keep an eye out for fruit fly. Keep using fly traps.

Reduce any risk of fungal problems in tomatoes by watering the plants roots and not the foliage. A handful of calcium around each plant will promote strong growth and help prevent blossom end rot, also water regularly.

Don't forget to regularly top up bird baths.

I hope you all have time to enjoy and appreciate your patch of garden and I wish each and everyone of you a safe, happy and healthy festive season.

## Back pain – Myths and truths

Like Santa we all have busy periods in the year and the last thing we need is to have back pain that limits our ability to do what we need to and interrupt our special times with our family and friends.

Here are some myths and truths that might help you to prevent or manage your back pain.

### **MYTH: An episode of back pain means I will have back pain forever.**

80% of people will experience 2-3 episodes of back pain in their lives. This does not mean they have a back injury -when you have a headache you don't say I have a head injury- it means that you have pain from sore muscles or joints that will recover with a short period of rest and then gradual return to activity.

Some, NOT ALL, people will have back injuries that they will have to be careful with and manage for the rest of their lives.

### **TRUTH: Exercising and remaining flexible helps prevent back pain.**

Tight and weak muscles can not function properly to support the structures in your spine. This can lead to poor movement patterns and increase your likelihood of developing degenerative changes and arthritis.

### **MYTH: Lifting is bad for your back**

Lifting objects that are too heavy for you or are in a bad position is bad for your back. BUT all lifting is not dangerous for your back. Being healthy, active and doing activities within your capabilities is good for you. Sedentary lifestyles – spending lots of time sitting – is frequently the cause of back pain.

### **TRUTH: Our bodies are designed to move.**

While there are good postures to maintain the majority of the time, our bodies are designed to move in all directions.

I recommend that everyone (unless you have a back injury that prevents it) lies on their stomach and stretches out the opposite way to what they have been doing all day for 5-10 minutes. Most of our activities during the day are in the front of our bodies and involve us leaning forward. It is important to stretch out the muscles and joints that have been held in the forward position.

### **MYTH: Bedrest is the only cure for back pain**

You should rest when you initially have back pain. Ideally this should only be for 1-2 days. Once able you should start gentle exercises within your pain limits that

progressively return your muscles and joints back to their normal function. Physiotherapy can be beneficial in teaching you how to progress your exercises and support your back during this period.

Remaining in bed for long periods can result in you developing tightness and stiffness because of the bedrest. When you then start to move it feels sorer because your body has tightened up and you do less to avoid the pain which is often the result of the bedrest rather than the original problem.

### **TRUTH: Good posture and careful lifting are good for your back**

Everyone has heard the rules for safe lifting but it never hurts to be reminded and reenergise our efforts to lift safely

- Test the load before you lift it
- Bend your hips and knees rather than your back
- Move your feet rather than twist your spine

Keep the load as close to you as possible

Merry Christmas and a happy and safe new year – If you can't be good make sure you are WELL.

Spiced Quail salad, with Pearl Cous Cous,  
Fresh Figs and Persian Feta



### Ingredients

1 packet of deboned quails (available in the poultry section at Harris Farm)  
2 Tbsp Moroccan spice mix, can be purchased as a spice mix but we have included a recipe for one  
1/2 packet of pearl cous cous  
3 ripe figs  
100g Persian Feta ( available in the nicer cheese part of Woolworths)  
handful of flat leaf parsley, torn roughly  
4 handfuls rocket  
60g toasted pine nuts

### Dressing

3 Tbsp Olive oil  
3 Tbsp veg oil  
1/2 lemon  
1 tsp honey  
Mix altogether and season

### Method

1. Divide each quail into 4 pieces and rub with the Moroccan spice mix. Set aside.
2. Bring to the boil a large pot of water and boil pearl cous cous until cooked through, but still tender. Mix a good drop of olive oil through the cous cous. Cool completely.
3. Heat bbq up and sear quails until lovely golden brown. But be careful the spice mix doesn't cause it to burn. Then place into 200 degree oven for 5 mins. ( they will be slightly pink, which is the best way to eat them.) Set aside and keep warm.
4. Slice figs thin, and mix with rocket, parsley and the cous cous. Season with salt and pepper. Mix with dressing.
5. Arrange on a large platter, and alternating place quail pieces, feta and pine nuts.

### Moroccan Spice Mix

1 tsp ground cumin  
1 tsp ground ginger  
1 tsp salt  
3/4 tsp ground black pepper  
1/2 tsp ground cinnamon  
1/2 tsp ground coriander  
1/2 tsp cayenne pepper  
1/2 tsp ground allspice  
1/4 tsp ground cloves

Other well known sites along the trail included Surgeon's Rock, Eora Creek, Templeton's Crossing, Myola, Mount Bellamy (the highest point on the track) Bomber's Campsite, Afogi Village, Brigade Hill, ( this is where the locals buried the Australian soldiers killed there) the Golden Staircase and 16 creek crossings on the last day, to the finish at Owen's Corner.

Simone's talk was so interesting that she was asked many questions by members at the conclusion.

My name is Lydia Herbert, and I am this year's Eugowra Miss Showgirl. I am excited to have been given the opportunity to write a monthly column for the Eugowra News about my experiences as showgirl.

For those of you who have not met me, my family operates a mixed

farming enterprise between Eugowra and Gooloogong. We produce sheep, cattle, grain, fruit and vegetables. When I am not at home I am studying a Bachelor of Veterinary Science at Charles Sturt University in Wagga Wagga. When I complete my course I hope to come back to this area to work with livestock. I have been involved with Eugowra show for as long as I can remember and am a committee member of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Youth Group.

This month I travelled to the Hawkesbury in western Sydney for the Farming Small Areas Expo, where our youth group ran a Junior Judging workshop aimed at high school students. Junior judging is a fantastic way to learn about all aspects of agriculture such as grain, fruit, sheep, cattle and wool. It is aimed at young people between the ages of 15 – 24, with competitions carried out across the state each year. Competitors are given a class of 4 exhibits (sheep, fleeces, cattle etc) and are asked to place them in order from first to fourth. Then they must explain why they placed them this way to the judge. The top placegetters at group finals win the right to compete at State Finals held at Sydney Royal Easter Show each year. It is a fantastic way to meet young people and to develop an interest in agriculture.

81 students from 7 schools attended our Hawkesbury workshop on the 9<sup>th</sup> of November. They were split into small groups to learn about dairy cattle, beef cattle, Merinos, fleeces, meat sheep, grain and fruit and vegetables. In the afternoon they were given some practice classes of wheat, Poll Dorset ewes and Limousin cattle. The students had a great day and learnt a lot about many aspects of agriculture. It was a great day and I enjoyed helping teenagers learn about agriculture, particularly in the Sydney area.

This is the second workshop our Youth Group has organised, with the first being held in Parkes in February this year. It was such a success that the participants have asked us to run a second one which will be held in February next year just before our own group final.

## UPDATE ON FLOOD MITIGATION ACTIVITIES

Cabonne Council is pleased to note significant progress has been made on proposed flood mitigation measures for Puzzle Flat Creek in Eugowra.

In April 2012 Council escalated preparations for this project through consultation with landowners and the Department of Premier and Cabinet (Office of Environment and Heritage). An application to the Office of Environment & Heritage for funding to assist with pre-construction costs was also submitted at that time.

Choosing not to wait for State funding approval for the pre-construction activities, Council subsequently awarded a tender to an international engineering company for a geotechnical assessment and report. The engineers delivered their findings to Council in August. The Office of Environment and Heritage was then requested to fast track the funding request whilst representatives of the Eugowra Promotion and Progress Association and Council met with the State Member for Dubbo, the Hon Troy Grant, in September to debrief him about the matter.

On 29 October 2012, Hon Troy Grant advised that funding for pre-construction activities and studies would be made available. The next step is to undertake an independent review of works completed to date and Council hopes to tender for this work early in 2013.

Meanwhile, a design for works within Eugowra Showground and Noble Street has been forwarded to the Eugowra Showground trust for their comment. Once Council receives advice from the Trust the Works Committee will recommend construction begin.

Council wishes to thank the Eugowra Promotion & Progress Association and the Hon Troy Grant for their dedicated attention and assistance with this matter.

Tuesday 6 September 1887 Sydney Morning Herald

During the recent Ministerial tour in the country, the Premier received a number of addresses from Public school children, composed and written by themselves, and in each instance read by one of their number, and those presentations to the author of the Public Schools Act were to him extremely gratifying. As a specimens of these addresses the following, which was presented in a little village called Murga, on the road from Cudal to Forbes, and which was written with black and red inks, the letters of the words appearing in red and black alternately, may be read with interest :

**“ Murga, August 81, 1887. To our beloved Premier, Sir Henry Parkes, K.C.M.G., M.P.** Sir,-With what pleasure do we hail this auspicious day, when young and old are able to praise God that He has permitted so venerable and warm-hearted a statesman to visit amongst us, and trust that the journey undertaken by you at your stage of life, and at so unpropitious a season, will prove beneficial to you and the country. We, the children, do heartily thank you for the many hours of self-sacrifice spent by you in maturing a plan

for the benefit of our education, and for the many lenient alterations made in the Act, which enable our parents to provide us with a good education without either expanse or inconvenience to themselves. Let us always sing in voices of praise while there is such a valuable and fertile-brained captain at the helm of State. As Mr. Gladstone is the great champion of English politics, so is Sir Henry the graet guardian of the colony's privileges. No doubt Sir Henry, you noticed the natural resources of our district as you passed through it; we are able to pioduce almost anything that can be grown in a naturally fertile country. Now the only thing that is needed to complete this district's stability is your careful consideration of our requirements. We all join in sincere prayer that you may long live to watch the State and guard her interests, and, when your end of days comes, that you will have a clear conscience that you have done a great duty to a young colony. We have the honour to be, most noble Knight, your obedient servants, the scholars of Murga and Nangar.”

### The importance of quarantine drenching

I have just seen the latest figures on drench resistance in the New England area so I thought this was good time to remind producers to be conscious of importing drench resistant worms when purchasing sheep.

The percentage of properties with drench resistance is increasing and the last few wet summers (with the increased need to drench) have further contributed to this. The approximate percentage of properties with drench resistance in the New England are as follows:

- Benzimidazole drench group – 91% barber's pole worm and up to 100% scour worms resistant
- Levamazole – Up to 57% barber's pole worm and 100% scour worm resistant
- Abamectin – Up to 100% barber's pole worm resistant. Resistance uncommon in scour worms
- Moxidectin – Up to 74% barber's pole worm resistant. Uncommon in scour worms
- Naphthalophos. Barber's pole worm resistance is rare. There is low efficiency with scour worms
- Closantel – Up to 77% barber's pole worm Resistance. This drench is not used for scour worm infestations
- 3-4 way combination drenches consisting of abamectin, albendazole, levamazole +/- closantel. 50% of properties tested showed that these

combination drenches had barber's pole worm resistance.

Resistance in our area is generally not as bad. From the survey conducted in the Lachlan LHPA recently (as a percentage of properties tested);

- Abamectin – 55% had barber's pole worm resistance and up to 34% small brown stomach worm and 18% Black scour worm resistance
- 3 way combination drench consisting of abamectin, albendazole and levamasole is showing good efficacy against barber's pole worm and scour worms
- Naphthalophos in combination with albendazole and levamisole is still working well against barber's pole worm. This drench combination works with varying effectiveness against the scour worms. Expect 60-80% of properties to have scour worm resistance to this combination.

From these statistics, to ensure you do not import a resistant worm population onto your property you need to use a 3-4 way combination drench if the sheep are from the local area. However if purchasing sheep from further afield such as the New England you need to consider quarantine drenching these sheep with a 3 way combination drench plus the new drench group monepantel (Zolvix). Be careful of withholding periods as this drench has an export slaughter interval of 115 days. If this is an issue then consider using Naphthalophos. This drench should not be given to hungry or stressed sheep. After drenching animals should be held of pastures for 24 hours while they 'empty out'. Ensure access to feed and water. Do a wormtest 10-14 days later to ensure the drench has worked. Don't forget to include your rams. For further advice on drenching sheep please call your district veterinarian at the Young, Forbes or Condobolin office of the Lachlan LHPA.

## Safe Chemical Handling – Risk Management

Safely storing and using chemicals is the responsibility of everyone on the farm. Without following correct procedures on the storage and the use of these highly dangerous chemicals can result in the often preventable tragic consequences.

Such consequences can occur at anytime as demonstrated in a tragic accident that occurred in the Darling downs area this month where a farmer lost his life spraying the chemical Paraquat with an 8L hand pump spray container. Unfortunately the sprayer ruptured which showered the farmer with the chemical all over his upper body and in his mouth. Even being sprayed down by a neighbor with water the farmer passed away the next day from the exposure. Link to full story,

After reading this and with spring nearing the end, I thought that it may serve as a timely reminder to all farmers, gardeners and anyone that stores, handles and uses chemicals to be careful when using potentially hazardous chemicals. It doesn't matter if you are spraying the garden or spraying 1000's of acres it is always important (and a legal obligation) to make sure the correct use of PPE (Personal protective equipment) is used.

Some key points;

- Always read the label on the drum and if appropriate the SDS safety data sheet (this replaces the MSDS sheets)
- All label rates are to be followed unless there is a corresponding registration permit
- Never pick up chemicals and put in the boot of cars (Ute it don't Boot it). This is a big one because resellers cannot put any chemicals in the boot of the car, even if it is 'just going down the road'.
- Always store chemicals up and away from children in a lockable area.
- Only use chemicals that are designed for the purpose. (Chemicals such as Paraquat is for agricultural use only, not gardeners).

And if ever in doubt with either chemical selection or just tips on how to apply safely and correctly the team at AgNVet are always happy to assist.

## Stored Grain Insects -

As with last months update, I thought I would put in a reminder for new grain that will hopefully be filling grain silos around the district.

Here are some options that can be used in this situation:

Treatment of clean, harvested grain

- Reldan Plus (500g/L chlorpyrifos-methyl + 30g/L s-methoprene)
- IGR grain pack (30g/L s-methoprene + 1000g/L fenitrothion)
- Rizacon S (300g/L s-methoprene)
- Fenitrothion (1000g/L fenitrothion)

AgNVet has plenty of all of these options on hand for quick turnaround so you can have peace of mind for the protection of your grain.
