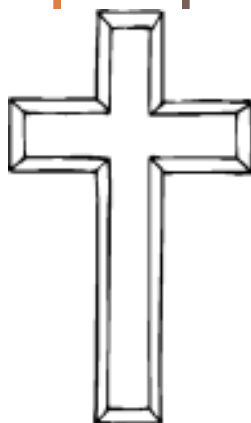

GROWING WILDFLOWERS FOR PROFIT

Central Tablelands Local Land Services is partnering with WildFlowers Australia and Landcare to host an information day on growing wildflowers commercially, coming up at the Orange Botanic Gardens on Tuesday 6 March. "The information day will provide essential background for anyone interested in learning more about entering this industry," said Senior Land Services Officer, Karen O'Malley. "The wildflower industry grows and markets flowers and foliage from a wide range of Australian and closely related South African species for the floristry industry, and there are many species that could be successfully grown in our region." WildFlowers Australia (WFA), the national industry organization, supports communication and networking between growers, flower wholesalers, exporters and importers, buyers such as florists, and plant growers. Local Land Services is working with WildFlowers Australia to provide local landholders with expert advice and information about the industry. Guest speakers on the day will include Bettina Gollnow, Communications & Extension Manager with WildFlowers Australia, Ben McInnes from Brush Top Farm (grower and domestic wholesaler), and Craig Scott from East Coast Wildflowers. Between them, Bettina, Ben and Craig have extensive experience in growing and selling a wide range of wildflower crops for both domestic and export markets, and in developing the broader wildflower. The program on the day will provide participants with a realistic industry overview, profiling key markets, basic advice on managing wildflower crops, and the essentials for establishing a commercial farm. While the program is targeted towards opportunities in the Central West and Central Tablelands, participants from further afield are welcome to attend. Thoughts from Ann

Can you remember what your first thought/memory was when you came to Eugowra?

I thought it was small. Everybody was very friendly. I always remember a lady in the community saying to me "you're not Margie Tildsley". I was the first of the first community nurses who was not born or lived here.

What have you learnt from Eugowra?

I've learnt heaps. I learnt about my limitations. I've learnt how to get contacts and support. To use the resources of the Health Service more.

Eugowra's community stick together and support one another when times are tough or help is needed.

The majority of the town are related and interrelated – You have to be very careful what you say!

What has Eugowra learnt from you?

Someone said to me the other day – you call a spade a spade. I think they have learnt that I tell the truth.

They have learnt even at the most embarrassing times you can have a laugh.

Such as when giving a suppository to a patient who is constipated. Not a pleasant thing for anybody. Patients are often very anxious and apprehensive. When they roll over, to lighten the mood, I comment "oh I can't find the hole" to which they relax and laugh. Then Job done.



What do you think has changed about Eugowra?

I think the Community is more aware of what services are available to them in Eugowra. I think they are beginning to utilise our services more. The community have increased knowledge and confidence in accessing the services of the MPS

What was the best thing that happened?

Working full time in Eugowra!! We have had a lot of fun. We have started a few things - Pink and bling, exercises, education.

What was the worst thing that happened?

I haven't had any really bad things happen. I had been visiting a client for years and the day that they went into care (and I was assisting them) I backed into a star picket that I had been avoiding for years and damaged the work car. Another time I had to ask a client to come and help me straighten their letterbox because I had bent it.

Running to the apex toilet when caught short – worse when the cleaners are there.

Pocket ringing Annette – when I got my new phone I'd put it in my pocket and forget to turn it off. Usually ringing Annette on the other end then wondering where the voices were coming from and realising it was Annette yelling at me to turn the phone off – worse when I was on the loo.

The saddest times are saying goodbye to patients that I have cared for during their illness. I try to give them the most dignified days but it breaks your heart when they leave.

What will you miss most?

The people in the Community and the staff at the MPS

The quirky things – ringing someone to get them to tie up their dog, knowing you can only visit some people at certain times because they are still asleep.

Fixing peoples irrigation systems, mobile phones and TV's.

Negotiating deals with washing machine people, electricity and phone providers

What was your greatest achievement in Eugowra?

Getting the Australia day award. It was very humbling and embarrassing. Kate Power told me to come and represent the MPS so I had no idea - everyone else knew and I ended up a blubbing mess. I'm not one to handle accolades. I remember accidentally swearing at my acceptance speech – and thinking holy shit!!

What are you looking forward to in your new role?

Less travel!!!!

After driving to and from Canowindra all these years which road is the best?

None!! Too many Roo's, potholes and slow cars.

Pomegranate is our Primary Product All CWA Branches will be promoting it this year.

The Pomegranate, *Punica granatum*, is an Old World fruit originating in the Middle East and Orient, where it enjoys popularity to this day. The tree may eventually grow to about 6 m tall and remain productive for many years. Specimen trees over 200 years old are recorded in Europe. In Australia the pomegranate is commercially insignificant, probably largely due to the availability of a wide range of preferred alternative fruits. Demand is thought likely to be satisfied by a relatively small volume of production. Supplies from domestic sources appear in Sydney wholesale markets during late summer/autumn. The market seeks relatively blemish-free, medium to large fruit, with plenty of red colour evident, both externally and in the juicy sub-acid pulp surrounding each seed. Seed should be tender. Good varieties have a large proportion of edible pulp to rind and cell partitions, which are unpalatable and bitter. The plant may be grown as a multiple-stemmed shrub or a single-stemmed tree. The latter is preferred.

About 20 Small marshmallow

200g butter

1 cup brown sugar

1/2 cocoa

1 tsp vanilla essence

395g can condensed milk

1 packet plain sweet biscuits, crushed

Desiccated coconut for rolling

Combine butter, condensed milk, sugar, cocoa and vanilla in a saucepan, stir over a low heat until all ingredients have melted and are combined together Allow to cool Stir in crushed biscuits Roll mixture into balls, placing a small marshmallow inside each Roll in coconut and refrigerate

N.B. I usually find that I need to re roll them after they have been refrigerated if mixture is still slightly warm!

A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY



GLIMPSES INTO OUR PAST.

From 100 years ago. It is believed that the young soldier mentioned in the following newspaper article lost his life during the fierce fighting in the Battle of Amman in Palestine on Good Friday 30th March 1918. Lance Corporal 1308 Eric Cheney. Camel Corps. He did not live locally, but was the brother of Eugowra residents, the late Frank & John Cheney. Like his mates, he rode into the battle on his camel and then into the sights of the huge guns when the order was given to leave his 'possie' and go over the top. His body was never recovered. When particulars were needed for the 'Roll of Honour' - to the question "What was his calling?" his father had answered "High School boy." The following is from an article in the National Advocate Bathurst 25 September 1915. Trooper Eric Cheney, of Newbridge, a local High School scholar, was farewelled in the Lecture Hall of the school (Blayney) yesterday morning. It stated that the Head-Master presided and wished the departing soldier well, as did the Rev. Collier. The whole school assembled and presented Eric with a wristlet watch, which one of the girl students pinned to his wrist. Cheers for the King and the student were given heartily. Trooper Cheney left by mid-day train.



Eugowra's Court Room was crowded in late February 1918 according to the Forbes Times, when locals Mr S and Mrs Y, his employer, faced charges involving a bag of wheat valued at 12 shillings, stolen from a stack, the property of N G McMillan, beside the fence on the Waugan road. The local Constable deposed that he had received some information and had proceeded to a spot along that road to where some wheat was stacked. He had seen Mr S & Mrs Y in a sulky, without lights, late in the evening of the 18th on that road. Their sulky was travelling slowly. Mr S had not told Mrs Y he was stealing the wheat, but that he had bought a bag that day. She had waited in the sulky until he carried the wheat out. Mrs Y then had to drive to the police station where the wheat was removed in two butts. the 19th. The wheat produced was in bags sewn with blue twine, same as he used. £7 in default of two months light labour. She was granted time to pay. Mr S paid his fine.

A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY



Forbes Advocate Friday 1 March 1918. Eugowra Saw Mills. Messrs. Elbourne & Hay, proprietors of the Eugowra Saw Mills, are at present executing an order for 60,000 feet of sawn timber for the State Government, for building purposes at the Government Stud Farm at Bangaroo, near Canowindra. To be able to secure and execute such an order is convincing evidence of the up-to-dateness and capacity of the Eugowra Saw Mills

Social news reported from Murga in March 1912 included reports of the wedding of Miss Cecily Carman and Mr. Almond Goodacre at the residence of the bride's parents at "Bow Glen" Murga.

Wedding presents are listed including a good number of silver items. When a 'Kitchen Tea' had been held the numerous gift included more cut glass jelly dishes than could be counted. However, among the practical items was a pair of flat irons from Mr. Peter Agostinelli and white wash brushes from two people. The listed Kitchen Tea gifts amounted to more than one newspaper columns!

Forbes Advocate Friday March 1929. School Over-Crowded. The Public School is at present seriously over-crowded with children. The Education Department is asked to immediately enlarge the school and build a residence for the teacher.



Passenger Rail Services operated on the Cowra- Eugowra line from 1922 until 1974.

One of the sidings along the line, close to the Eugowra end, was that of Trajere. Now the site of the well used wheat terminal silo, it was a pickup and drop off point for travellers and for school children who were educated in Eugowra. The Trajere photograph looks rather like an illustration for an Australian Classic Novel. The other shows the local Eugowra Station in its early days.

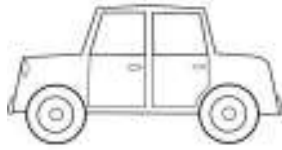

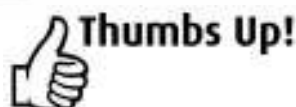
