## *To the Editor*

### THE DIFFICULTIES OF LIVING IN A DUAL SHIRE COMMUNITY

Referring to the permitted fire on "Galwary" Amaroo Way, Eugowra on February 21st 2017.

It has come to my attention that this permitted fire has caused considerable stress to some Eugowra residents. I apologise for any stress caused however: -

The facts are: - this fire was a permitted burn with the permit issued by me Eugowra North Brigade Captain and Deputy Group Captain under supervision of the Mid-Lachlan Valley Area Command.

All adjoining landholders were informed the day prior as is protocol and the group captain of Cabonne, Bruce Noble was informed.

The controlled burn began late in the afternoon as required with a 7-metre fire break around the area cut into 5 blocks. Although spectacular from a distance, the fire was handled in a controlled manner by experienced firefighters and none of the breaks were breached and hardly any water was used to attend the fire. The fire was patrolled for a further hour after the burn and again at first light. I was in constant contact with the brigade members managing the burn.

I have since found a glitch in the 000 system after contact with Canobolas Area Command and The Mid-Lachlan Area Command, learning that 000 calls from the Cabonne Shire are directed to Orange and calls within the Forbes shire are directed to Forbes. It is important when calling 000 fire that you state where the fire is and suggest it could be in the Forbes Shire when calling from Eugowra, then the call will be redirected.

Another problem arises because the Forbes Shire has been issuing permits weather permitting and Cabonne Shire has not. When the fire is near a shire boundary the communication is blurred. Fire captains in the Forbes Shire are regularly updated as to when permits can be issued along with total fire bans and wind speeds on a regular basis.

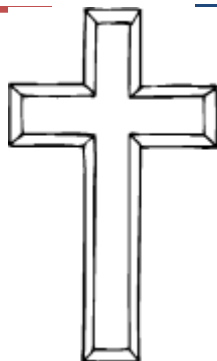

## December Winner: Jake Greenhalgh

Congratulations to local lad, Jake Greenhalgh for his efforts on the sporting field and Motor cross achievements for 2016. Jake is the eldest son of Jodie and Ben Greenhalgh and is now in Year 7 at Red Bend Catholic College in Forbes.

Jake was a busy young man as an all round sportsperson during his last year of Primary School. In Year 6 he participated in swimming, athletics and cross country at representative level, being the age champion for the 100m, 200m, 800m races, high jump and long jump in the Small Schools Carnivals and in the Lachlan Districts Carnivals winning the 100m, 200m, senior and PP5 relays and went on to compete in the PSSA (Primary State Schools Athletics) carnival in Dubbo. Jake won the Small Schools Cross Country and came 2nd in the Lachlan District run.

At the end of 2016 he was awarded the Patricia Capes Award at school for Sporting Excellence.

In Motorcross, Jake won the 9-11 years Riverina Interclub Warnabrook MX Series Champion for 85cc and won at all four club meets – Leeton, Young, Holbrook and Tumbarumba.

He was the 85cc 9-11 years champion in Young, winning all six rounds of the competition. Jake represented at Orange, Canberra and Lakes State Motorcross titles – in each he raced in the top 15 out of 40 in the state. He placed ninth of 36 riders at the Coffs Harbour Stadium motocross championships even after a fall in the second race affected his overall placing.

When I first arrived back here in Eugowra in 2013 I was asked to talk at the CWA meeting and I mentioned a young girl suffering terribly with Ricketts.



So many people have often asked about my little PNG girl, so it is great that I can share this wonderful story with you.

A brief history.

When Maria Joseph was two years her parents died and she was totally neglected and ended up with Ricketts. The sisters in Vanimo, where I used to live, asked if I would try to find help for Maria Joseph. I tried every avenue in Australia but to no avail. Through prayers, finance and a trip to Vanimo by a friend, Maria Joseph can face a future full of hope and love.

Someone said to me, 'Helen there are children suffering all over the world.'

'Yes I know all too well, but together we can help this one.'

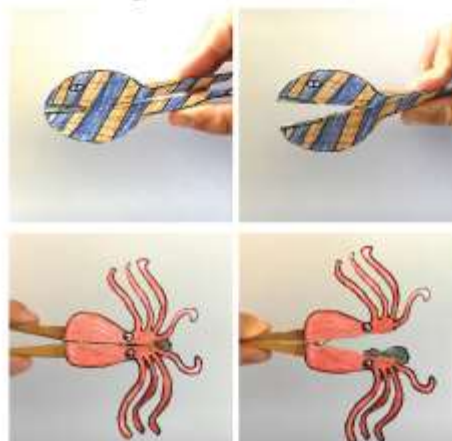
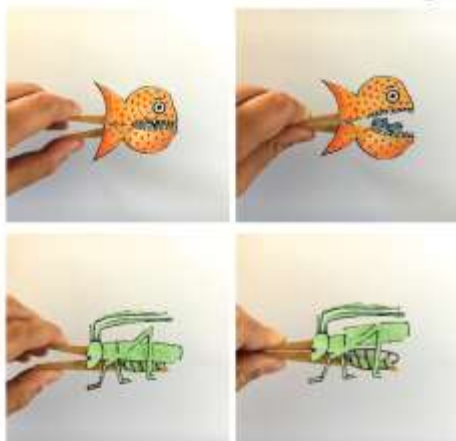

## Autumn Recipe

### Mini Pies

These mini pies are so easy and delicious to put together using only a few ingredients if you use ready-made puff pastry dough. The kids will love them.

#### INGREDIENTS

2 Sheets of puff pastry

Applesauce (either homemade or buy a jar from the supermarket)

Milk to glaze

Use cookie cutters to cut out your pie shape, you will need a top and a bottom for each pie. On the top sheet get another smaller cutter and cut out in the centre.

Spread the applesauce on the bottom sheet, leaving the edges clear. Put the top sheet on and press around the edges with a fork to seal. Brush with milk and sprinkle a little sugar.

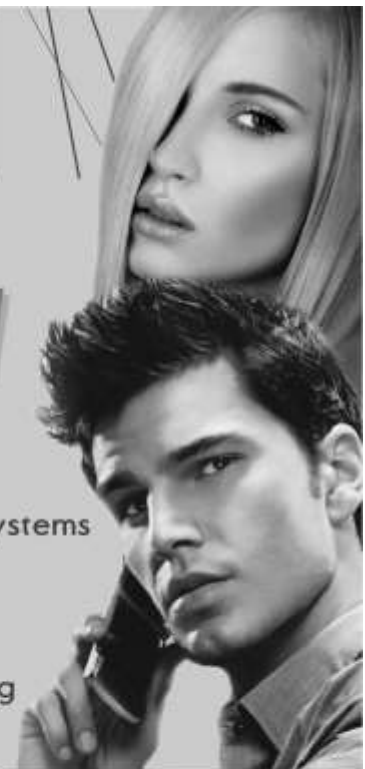

## THE ~ SEASONAL KITCHEN ~

# ZUCCHINI PICKLES

We haven't had the usual glut of Zucchini this year due to the heat and the dry weather but I have enough for a few batches of this excellent pickle that is nice with cold meats or just spread on your toast.

### INGREDIENTS

- 1kg Zucchini (no more than 15-20cm long, otherwise there are too many seeds.)
- 3 tablespoons Cooking Salt
- 1 Brown Onion
- 2 cups White Vinegar
- 2 cups White Sugar
- 2 tablespoons Cornflour
- 2 teaspoons Turmeric Powder
- 2 teaspoons Mustard Powder (Keens)
- 1 teaspoon Curry Powder (Keens)



### METHOD

Using a food processor or grater, cut the zucchini into thin julienne pieces. You want a chunky piece, otherwise once cooked it will all become mush. Place all the grated Zucchini into a bowl, stir through the salt and then cover with water – just enough to cover the top of the Zucchini. Leave for fifteen minutes.

While the Zucchini is sitting in the salt brine – you can prepare the onion and other pickle ingredients.

Slice the onion into fine pieces.

Combine the corn flour, turmeric, mustard and curry powder in a measuring jug. Then gradually add enough vinegar to make a smooth paste, once smooth keep adding the vinegar while stirring.

Back to the Zucchini!

Tip it into a colander over the sink, and press down firmly with your hands or a potato masher to remove the brine. DO NOT RINSE.

Place the Zucchini, onion, sugar and vinegar/spice mixture into a saucepan. Start with medium heat to get it simmering, then adjust as needed to maintain a gentle boil.

It will take around 25 minutes to thicken up, stir occasionally.

Once thick, take it off the heat. Spoon into hot, clean, sterilised jars. If using cold jars, then allow to cool before bottling.

Fill to the top, leaving half a centimeter of space. Tighten the lids and allow to cool to room temperature. Once cooled, add labels if desired. Best stored in the fridge.

# A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY

*It will be 200 years in late April since the arrival in our area of a group of European Explorers. George Evans and his small group reached the junction of the Lachlan River and Mandagery Creek on 1 June 1815 before returning to Bathurst. Always looking for an inland sea, and to find out where the rivers ran, John Oxley and his team ventured further inland in 1817 accompanied by George Evans. With them was a man named Byrne (spelt in various ways in later reports) and it was after this man that our Mandagery Creek was named. It was just recorded as a wet creek by Evans. Although Eugowra has made no plans to mark the occasion there will be a function in the Canowindra area at the site of a depot used by Oxley and his party.*

*Eugowra will be holding the Murals weekend at the time and there will be an 'Open Weekend' at the local Historical Museum and Bushranger Centre.*

These are the entries from the journal of John Oxley, covering the days relevant to Eugowra.

**1817 April 28.** — Fine clear mild weather. Proceeded with the remainder of the baggage to join the boats down the river; arrived at Lewis's Creek, which, although nearly dry when crossed by Mr. Evans in 1815, is now a considerable stream. The distance from the depot is about nine miles; the country on both banks of the river low but good: the upper levels would afford excellent grazing, but the soil is of inferior quality: the points of the low hills end alternately on each side the river. The land up both banks of Lewis's Creek is very rich, and covered with herbage. The boats had come safely down the river, although the large boat grounded once; the river appears to me to be from three to five feet above its usual level.

Several specimens of crystallized quartz were found on the adjoining hills, also some small pieces of good iron ore.

**April 29.** — Proceeded on our journey down the river, directing the boats to stop at the creek which terminated Mr. Evans's former journey. The country through which we passed this day in every respect resembles the tracts we have already gone over. The crowns and ridges of the hills are uniformly stony and barren, ending as before alternately on each side of the river; the greater proportion of good flat land lies on the south side of the river; there are however very rich and fertile tracts on this side. After riding about eight miles, we ascended a considerable hill upon our right, from the top of which we could see to a considerable distance; between the south-west and north-north-west, a very low level tract lay west of us, and no hill whatever bounded the view in that quarter. Three remarkable hummocks bore respectively S. 72. W., S. 51 1/2 W. and S. 34 1/2 W., within which range of bearing the country was uniformly level, or rising into such low hills, as not to be distinguished from the general surface. The tops of distant ranges could be discerned over low hills in the north-west, whilst, from north by the east to south, the country was broken into hill and valley. The whole of this extensive scene was covered with eucalypti, whilst on the rocky summits of the hills in the immediate neighborhood a species of callitris was eminently distinguished. From this extensive view I named the hill Mount Prospect.

At five o'clock in the afternoon we arrived at the place where the horses had been directed to wait for the boats, but they had not arrived; the distance is at least doubled by following the immediate course of the stream, but I had calculated that its rapidity would make up for the distance, and enable the boats to keep pace with the horses.

At six o'clock the boats arrived safe, the men having had a very fatiguing row, and been obliged to clear the passage of fallen trees, and other obstructions; so that we determined to give them some repose, and halt here for the night. At half past eight o'clock proceeded down the river, intending to stop at the termination of Mr. Evans's journey in 1815, about five miles further, for the purpose of repairing the small boat, which had sustained some slight damage in coming down the river yesterday. I rode about three miles back into the country; the callitris was here more frequent, though not of large growth; the soil is not good.

In returning to the river we came upon the creek which terminated Mr. Evans's journey, down which we travelled until we came to the river, about half a mile from which is a large shallow lagoon, full of ducks, bustards, black swans and red-hills. At twelve o'clock the horses arrived at the mouth of the creek, and the boats half an hour afterwards. The banks of the creek were very steep, and it was three o'clock before all the provisions were got over. The creek was named Byrne's Creek, after one of the present party, who had accompanied Mr. Evans in his former journey.

**May 1.** — The creek fell upwards of a foot during the night, by which some of the articles in the large boat received damage. Commenced the survey of the river from this point. The flats on both sides the river were very extensive, and in general good; the same timber and grass as usual; the stream was from thirty to forty yards broad on an average. There was not even a hillock on which to ascend during this day's route, so that our view was bounded by less than a mile on each side of the river. Traces of the natives were observed, but no natives were seen. The boats were much impeded by fallen timber: it was half past two o'clock when they arrived at the place where I intended to halt, although we had only gone between nine and ten miles.

## Community Effort Greens Self Care Units Gardens.

Several Community minded people picked the hottest week of the year to install an automatic watering system at the Self Care Units recently. Brian Dwyer designed the system and pegged it out and Ron Hay and his trusty bobcat dug the trenches and helped with the installation. Brian Moon and resident plumber, Johnny Kuntze were also involved in this very hot job. There were lots of laughs, plenty of blood and sweat, but no tears! The residents are very grateful and now have a much more pleasant outlook. Also to benefit from the project were the Eugowra Garden Club and Eugowra Swimming Club. The volunteers decided to donate the money saved by installing the system themselves to the Garden and Swimming Clubs. Many thanks to the volunteers and well done on a worthwhile community project. Our thanks to David Hyde too for the running repairs he did at the units in the heat. David hasn't been well, but nothing is too much trouble for him. Eugowra is indeed fortunate to have so many volunteers who give their time so willingly.

## It's better to be late than DEAD on time.

Being fatigued significantly increases the risk of a crash. It makes us less aware of what is happening on the road and impairs our ability to respond quickly and safely if a dangerous situation arises. Driver fatigue is believed to contribute to more than 30% of road crashes.

**We all think we have the situation under control – but we don't.**

### Symptoms of driver fatigue



It is very difficult for drivers to accurately assess their own level of fatigue. The ability to self-assess becomes increasingly impaired as you get more fatigued, however the self-confidence in this ability remains. Nevertheless, there are some warning signs to look out for, including:

- Trouble focusing, or narrowing of attention
- Head nodding, or inability to keep the eyes open
- Not remembering the last few minutes
- Poor judgement, slower reaction time
- "Zoning out"
- Daydreaming and wandering thoughts
- Constant yawning or rubbing your eyes
- Drifting in the lane

If you are experiencing any of these symptoms of driver fatigue, it is very likely that your driving performance is already impaired.

### Causes of driver fatigue

There are two main causes of driver fatigue:

- Lack of quality/quantity of sleep
- Driving at times of the day when you would normally be sleeping.

The end result is not getting enough sleep, which can lead to a build-up of a "sleep debt" – this is essentially the sleep that you 'owe' yourself. **The only way to repay this debt is by sleeping.**

### Consequences of driver fatigue

The consequences of driver fatigue can be disastrous.



Because fatigue

impairs mental processing and decision making abilities, drivers can lapse into a "micro-sleep" without realising. This may only last a few seconds, but if it coincides with the need to perform some critical driving task (e.g. turning the wheel or responding to a stop signal), the risk of crashing is greatly increased.

These accidents typically involve a single vehicle that departs the driving lane and collides with another object, such as a tree beside the road or another vehicle. The driver is often alone, having been driving for some hours, often between midnight and 6am.

The consequences of accidents attributed to driver fatigue are often the most serious in terms of death, injuries and property damage because the fatigued driver makes no attempt to avoid the impending crash.

**If you have someone you love or someone who loves you - take more time, have a rest and save them from years of sorrow.**



*Its better to be late..... (cont)*

Before you drive:

- Get a good night's sleep
- Avoid driving at night when your body will naturally want to sleep
- Arrange to share the driving
- Avoid long drives after work
- Plan to take regular breaks from driving (use rest areas)
- Ask someone for a lift
- Find out if any medicine you are taking may affect your driving

If you feel tired when driving:

- Pull over in a safe place for a nap (20 minutes works best)
- Swap drivers if you can
- Stop for a coffee if you're on a short drive, although the effects of caffeine won't help for long and won't work for everyone. Caffeine is not suitable for some people and can be harmful. Limits on the daily consumption of caffeine are recommended.
- Even if you don't feel tired, take regular breaks to avoid becoming tired

**Remember that sleep is the only way to overcome tiredness.**



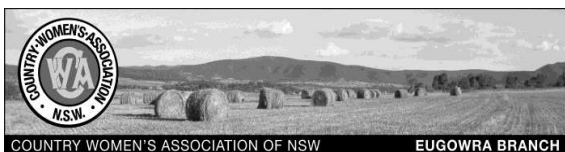
